The idea comes from the belief that contributing to the protection of the environment and prevention of pollution related to business operations from the organization is because good industry operators must treat the community and society as part of its organization.

The company has set an environmental policy to be consistent with the objectives and context of the organization by engaging all employees as follows:

1. Continuously improve environmental performances and achieve targets, including prevention of pollution by identifying significant environmental issues.

2. Comply with relevant environmental legislation and regulations, and other requirements which are related to operations, including developing new products for energy conservation.
